Achievement Pin Award Applications

The 4-H Achievement Pin Awards are based on individual 4-H project work and participation. Pins include: Membership, Bronze, Clover, Emerald, Silver, Silver Guard, Jr. Leadership, Gold, and Gold Guard. A 4-H'er may receive only one of these a year. 4-H members should turn these applications into their **Community Leader along with their record book.**

We will recognize 4-H Clubs for **Club Seals** (purple, blue, red, etc.) and **Project Awards** such as: Safety, Health, Citizenship, Community Service, etc. These reports need to be completed and turned in by **October 3rd.**

Outstanding 4-H'er Award

This award recognizes Harvey County 4-H members who have demonstrated leadership and dedication to the Harvey County 4-H program. Club leaders can nominate deserving members, or 4-H members can nominate themselves for consideration by completing the application.

There are four, \$50 awards available each year. 4-H'ers who have already been given this award are not eligible to reapply.
